Message from the Headteacher

Mount Grace achieves Academy Status

Mount Grace will join the small but growing number of successful schools with academy status from 1st August 2011. Students and their families will not notice any immediate changes mainly because the school is buying back into most of the services we use from the Local Authority. During next year we will be reviewing all our contracts with a view to keeping those that work well for us and seeking alternative providers where we are not happy with the existing service.

The main benefit is that we are given funding for the services directly from central government and this will mean a net benefit to the school of around £150,000 per annum for the time being. We are determined that this independence (from the Local Authority) will help us take Mount Grace to the next stage of its development. We intend to continue working closely with our feeder primary schools in the district and collaborating with our secondary neighbours, including Chancellors and Dame Alice Owen.

Mount Grace leads the new Extended Schools Partnership

Mount Grace also takes over the leadership of the Extended Schools Partnership from September 2011. We are delighted to be actively supporting the development of the new Partnership of Potters Bar and District Schools. More details of this will be published during the Autumn Term.

YEAR 11 LEAVE OF ABSENCE 2011 – 2012

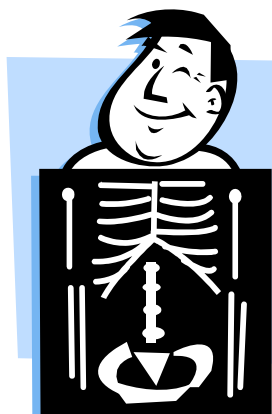

We were in need of a new artificial cricket wicket as the old one was becoming very difficult to play on. At a cost of nearly £11,000 it was going to take us some time to raise the funds however, a grant from The Lord's Taverners started the ball rolling and the challenge to reach our target by Easter was on.

Local councillors donated money from their Ward Initiative budgets and the county council contributed as well. Our thanks go County Councillor John Usher and to the borough councillors John Donne, Martin Worster, Paul & Sarah Hodgson Jones, James Ricks and Robert Calcutt.

Mr Smith, Mr Thomas and Mr Palmer organised a sponsored cricket marathon in March which raised an amazing amount thanks to the efforts of the pupils who took part and the generosity of their families.

We are also very grateful to the PTFA who contributed money raised at the Quiz Night in May and a donation from the Covenant Trustees of the School.

The new pitch was installed just before the Easter holidays and, after waiting a while for some rain to water it in, the PE department have been making great use of their new facility.

Last Friday a "grand opening" took place attended by Councillor Usher and Councillor Donne. The annual "Springate Fiddler Cup" match provided the entertainment and a sumptuous cricket tea was laid on to create the perfect evening. 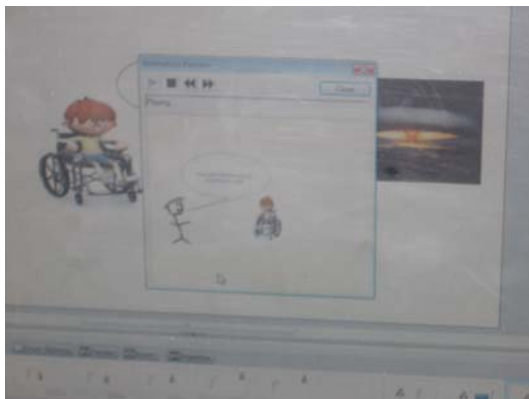

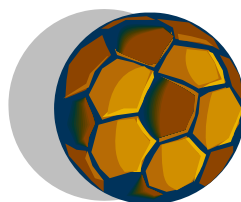
