Special Education Needs Policy

The school's full policy can be obtained by contacting reception. We assess students' literacy levels, obtain assessment and special needs data from previous schools and review our Special Needs Register twice a year. Most students are catered for by their class teachers differentiating resources and activities in lessons. Students whose special needs carry additional funding are supported in lessons by classroom assistants. Some withdrawal from lessons is arranged in a few cases to allow for specialist teaching and support. The curriculum at Key Stages 3-5 is constructed to enable students of all abilities to achieve success.

Child Protection Policy

The full policy can be obtained by contacting reception. The school has a duty to pass on any concerns relating to student safety/welfare to CSF (Children, School and Families). Such information can come from students themselves, from friends and family and/or from observations and conversations with school staff. All staff receive annual Child Protection Training. The Designated Teacher for Child Protection is Mrs Crawford.

Policies

School policies are available upon request on such matters as provision for students with special educational needs, charging for school activities, health and sex education and equal opportunities.

Admissions

Mount Grace School welcomes students of all abilities. We are a truly comprehensive school.

All admission arrangements are made through Hertfordshire County Council. Places are allocated according to the County Council admissions criteria. The criteria are available from CSF, County Hall, Hertford, SG13 8DF. We welcome applications from outside Hertfordshire. Parents should apply using the application form at the back of the `Moving On` book . Applications from parents outside of Hertfordshire need to apply through their own authority quoting Mount Grace code 919 5411. Please note: Mount Grace operates its own "Continuing Interest List" after normal allocations in March. Contact the school directly for further information.

In the 2007/08 admissions round we admitted 132 students.

It needs to be noted that the 2007/08 outcomes in terms of admission and appeals is not a perfect guide for next year's decisions.

Uniform

At Mount Grace we expect a high standard of personal appearance. We have a uniform and ask parents to support us in maintaining high standards of dress.

Girls in Years 7 to 11 wear the school pleated skirt (grey, red, black and white plaid) or black uniform trousers, black school jumper with school logo, white blouse, black/neutral tights and flat black shoes. Black uniform trousers with the school logo are an optional extra. The school blazer is optional for girls.

Boys in Years 7 to 11 wear black trousers, black blazer with badge, black school jumper, white shirt, school tie, grey/black socks and flat black shoes.

Make-up, jewellery, body piercing and extreme fashion hairstyles are not regarded as acceptable or appropriate for school.

The school uniform code is rigorously maintained. The school will contact parents and may send home students who are inappropriately dressed.

Curriculum Organisation

The curriculum at Mount Grace is designed both to satisfy National Curriculum requirements and to meet the wide range of our students' needs.

In Key Stage Three, Year 7, the majority of lessons are taught in mixed ability groups. This is true of Art, Music, Drama, Business Dynamics/ICT, French, English, Design Technology and Humanities: Geography, History, Citizenship and Religious Studies (CRS). Science and Maths are taught in half year groups to allow setting.

In Year 8 and 9 students continue to study all subjects from Year 7. They are usually taught in mixed ability groups. Science, Maths and Modern Foreign Languages (French & German) are taught in half year groups to enable setting.

At Key Stage Four students follow a core curriculum of GCSEs in English Language, English Literature, Mathematics and Science. Students also have lessons in Citizenship and Religious Studies (CRS) leading to a GCSE in General Studies. Physical Education is also taught as part of the core curriculum.

- Humanities (History, Geography)
- Art
- Technology (Resistant Materials, Graphics, Textiles, Food)

Some students take GCSE examinations a year or more early to allow them to progress to A/AS level work as appropriate. In some subjects, students work towards additional GCSE's after school.

Sixth Form

The Sixth Form is an important and thriving part of life at Mount Grace. Our 'open access' policy allows students to choose from a wide variety of carefully targeted level 2 and level 3 courses. These include a comprehensive range of BTEC/OCR Nationals in Business, PE, Health and Social Care, Music Technology, Media, Dance, ICT and Drama. Additionally, there is a wide range of AS and A levels to choose from. Minority subjects, such as Law and Sociology, can be accessed through our participation within the East Hertsmere Consortium of Schools of which we are a key member or by using the interactive video conference suite. Students have access to a new study centre during non teaching time.

Opportunity exists for students to play an active role in volunteering activities and to participate in the Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme. Our Business and Enterprise status brings with it the chance to work closely with business partners, often in exciting and challenging special activity days.

The Sixth Form are senior members of the school and are involved in the wider policy making decisions of the school; they are encouraged to work closely with teaching staff, pupils and the wider community.
