## *Outline of course/units covered*



This course has been designed for students to understand visual language in a wide variety of materials and techniques and to learn to research, analyse and learn from other artists' work. In addition, students will use visual language to stimulate ideas, to develop and then realise them.

The Art and Design course will cover a number of key areas in art, craft and design: Graphic Design, Fine Art, 3-D Design, Surface Design, Multimedia and Design Crafts. These skills will prepare students for further study in the area as well as entry into employment or self-employment.

If you want to pursue a career in the media than this is the right course for you in year 12. This course will develop the broad range of skills necessary to work in the media. It will also prepare you for the Level 3 courses that the school offers.

There are **four units** that are mandatory:

**Unit 1 Introduction to the media**

**Unit 2 Pre-production**

**Unit 3 Introduction to production**

**Unit 4 Marketing and presenting a media product**



There are **nine optional units** of which you will only have to do two to complete an evidence folder of **six units** in total.

All units are assessed through assignments set and marked by the teachers of the subject; this is then moderated by an OCR Visiting Moderator.
