<p>1. <u>Research</u> Collect pictures of, or draw a selection (between 6 and 12) of multicultural bags. Stick them down on a sheet of A4 or A3 paper and annotate them. (write down what you like and dislike about them eg colours, shape, size, handle, fabric, pocket, fastening, embroidery, decoration) What specific techniques are used in each country?</p>	<p>Level 3-4</p>
<p>2. Investigate recycling. Find out what materials are recycled in your area and what the items can be used for. What are the advantages and disadvantages of recycling each item? What recycled items could you collect to add to your bag?</p>	<p>Level 4-5</p> <p>To obtain levels 4 -5 you must also complete the above tasks</p>
<p>3. Complete <u>SCAMPER</u> worksheet 1 in detail.</p> <p>Complete several other <u>SCAMPER</u> worksheets for a range of products. Add as much detail as you can to the sketches and notes.</p>	<p>Level 5-7/8</p> <p>To obtain levels 5 -7/8 you must also complete all the above tasks</p>
